

Dear Parents, Carers and Staff

Update: Arncliffe West Infants School is part of the Kogarah Education Strategy

The Department of Education's School Infrastructure delivery unit assesses school infrastructure to identify the best way to distribute student numbers and deliver new and upgraded facilities for the whole community.

A number of School Infrastructure projects are currently being planned and are underway in the Kogarah area. These include:

- A short term project to refurbish five unused buildings at the department's former Cairnsfoot School site, 14-18 Loftus Street, Turrella
- The temporary relocation of the International Maarif School of Australia
 to the refurbished buildings, accommodating up to 60 Kindergarten to Year 4
 students for one year while their school is being upgraded.
- Kogarah Education Strategy review of school infrastructure requirements including upgrade requirements at Arncliffe West Infants School.

1. CAIRNSFOOT SCHOOL - BUILDING REFURBISHMENT

A project is underway to refurbish five buildings on the department's former Caimsfoot School site by mid-2019.

This will involve the following changes:

- Departmental Sports Unit after internal fit out work is completed, up to 30 departmental staff will be relocated
- Departmental Arts Unit will be using block D and C for storage once work is complete.

2. INTERNATIONAL MAARIF SCHOOLS OF AUSTRALIA

Teachers and up to 60 students from Kindergarten to Year 4 will be temporarily relocated to the department's former Caimsfoot School site on Day 1, Term 1 2019 while the school's permanent location is upgraded.

The school will operate between 8.00am and 4.00pm Monday to Friday during school term, excluding public holidays and will operate from 1 January 2019 to 31 December 2019.

Please note the main building at the department's former Caimsfoot School site is heritage listed and will not be impacted. To view the utilisation of the buildings, please turn overleaf.

What to expect

 Refurbishment works will take place from 7.00am to 5.00pm Monday to Friday and 8.00am to 12.30pm on Saturday.

- There will be a temporary increase in traffic during the refurbishment work from early December 2018 to mid-2019.
- Traffic control measures will be in place to ensure community safety around the site.

3. KOGARAH EDUCATION STRATEGY

The Kogarah Education Strategy will review school infrastructure requirements to meet future enrolment growth in the area. This will involve the assessment of demographic trends, educational requirements, the condition of schools, catchment boundaries, site sizes, transport links and community joint use partnership opportunities.

Amcliffe West Infants School, in addition to other schools in the area will be considered as part of this strategy which is currently in the early planning stages. The strategy will also include recommendations that will inform future school infrastructure projects in the area and surrounding schools.


